Covenant Control - Balanced Bookkeeping & Community Assoc. Management Kristi and Monte McKitterick

Inevitably, from time to time, community rules are broken. When this happens, the association informs residents about the problem and follows what is known as due process procedure.

Simply stated, this means that the association always notifies residents of alleged violations before taking any action. We send written notice describing the possible rule violation and ask the residents to correct the

problem voluntarily. These notices also explain any action the association may take if the violation isn't corrected.

The association understands that things aren't always, as they seem. We can arrange for residents to meet with the board before imposing any type of penalty. In fact, imposing penalties isn't the goal at all! It's more important that residents comply with the association rules for the good of everyone in the community. These meetings give residents and the board an opportunity to discuss rule violations informally and arrive at a solution.

After they've had a chance to talk to a resident about a rule violation, board members will discuss the situation among

> themselves and make a decision. Residents generally receive the board's decision in writing. For those who may disagree with the decision, the association has an appeal process.

With this in mind it's time to start getting ready for spring and summer. With the changing of sea-

sons come the weeds, probably the number one issue homeowners receive a notice for. Please keep the cracks of your driveway, sides of fences, rocked areas, and lawn areas free from weeds. Other landscaping issues are dead trees and plants, you don't have to replace them but please remove them from your lot. Vista Mesa is getting older please check the paint on your house and trim and submit an application to the ACC if it needs to be re-painted. With the problems the housing market has been having its important to keep our homeowners association to the highest standards to keep the values as high as possible.

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Parks and Trail

Spring and summer are fast approaching and that means more activity in the Valley. The ecosystem in our valley is very fragile and must be protected. When we use the trails and natural areas there are a few things we have to remember:

- 1. Don't litter and pick up any trash you see.
- 2. Don't dump grass clippings or other yard waste in the valley.
- 3. Be careful of wash outs and erosion when heavy rains have occurred. Walls can collapse making trails more dangerous.
- 4. Be mindful of the trees in the valley. Some are hundreds of years old.

5. Remember that the valley and trails are for our enjoyment. Please be responsible so it will be there for years to come.

Also this past year we hired a new landscaper and gardener for the association. We are hoping for some fresh and new colors and greenery in our sign areas and along the trailheads. These areas have been over looked for several years and have overgrown becoming unsightly but that will begin to change this year.

Remember these areas are for your enjoyment. Let's protect and take care of them.
